# Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Student of the Year

The Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Student of the Year award recognises the achievement of an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander student who is undertaking an apprenticeship, traineeship or a course of study leading to a national qualification, and who has been outstanding in aspects of their training and demonstrates the relevance of lifelong learning.

## Eligibility criteria

You must:

- identify as an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander person;
- be a permanent resident of Australia
- meet the criteria of the School-based Apprentice of the Year award, the Vocational Student of the Year award, the Apprentice of the Year award or the Trainee of the Year award.

2020 state winners of this category are automatically nominated for the Australian Training Awards.

## Preparing your application

### Section A: Overview

Provide a short overview outlining the qualification you enrolled in, your RTO and employer (if applicable), as well as your reason for choosing your industry and training path.

*(limit: 300 words)*

### Section B: Applicants will be judged against the following criteria

Criterion 1: Career and study achievements

Criterion 2: Team and communication skills

Criterion 3: Ability to be an ambassador (representative) for training in Australia

Criterion 4: Community engagement

## Addressing the criteria

In your application, you must present information in a way that clearly addresses the award criteria.

The judging panel will look for evidence of how your training has contributed to your career and study plans, the development of your skills and your achievements to date, as well as any way in which your training may have helped you to engage with the community.

The dot points listed under each criterion give you an idea of what to include in your application.

### Criterion 1: Career and study achievements

Consider things such as:

- why did you choose your course?
- how has it changed or impacted on you?
- what have you gained from it?
- have you had to address any challenges that have impacted on your training?

*(limit: 400 words)*

### Criterion 2: Team and communication skills

Consider any skills you have developed through your training, such as:

- what you have been able to tell others, students, friends etc about your training
- what you like about working in a team setting
- what traits you think are important to positively influence others.

*(limit: 400 words)*

### Criterion 3: Ability to be an ambassador (representative) for training in Australia

Detail for us:

- examples of where you have taken a leadership role inside or outside of work
- what other activities you have been involved in where you have been a representative
- how you would describe the quality of your training.

*(limit: 400 words)*

### Criterion 4: Community engagement

You may wish to include information about:

- how you are connected with your community/extended family
- how the training has impacted on your community
- what qualities you have or activities you have been involved in that you feel would be useful in your role as Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Student of the Year
- your achievements in areas other than study and work.

*(limit: 400 words)*

### Attachments

Up to five (5) single sided A4 page attachments are permitted, with each attachment to be provided at a 100 per cent ratio, one document per page. Attachments should be referenced in your application.



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
